Sir, I am directed to say that the Shetty Commission vide para. 19.172 of its Report had recommended leave encashment to judicial officers as under:-(i) Benefit of availing encashment of leave be extended to all Judicial officers in 19.172. all the States/UTs without insisting on the availment of leave simultaneously. (ii) Judicial Officers in all the States/UTs be allowed to encash leave not exceeding one month in a block period of two years. (iii) The encashment of leave be made tax-free. The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has considered the recommendation at (iii) above regarding the encashment of leave be made tax-fee in I.A. No.223 of 2007 in W.P.(C) No.1022 of 1989 –All India Judges Association & Others Vs UOI & Others. The Court vide its order dated 20.07.2006 had, inter-alia, directed that "In Paragraph 19.172, the Shetty Commission recommends that encashment of leave be made tax free. The Central Government is directed to consider issuing appropriate orders/exemption, the recommendation having Scabeen accepted by this Court in paragraph (37) of All India Judges Association & Ors. (supra)." On an application filed by the Central Government, the Supreme Court has, on 3.103.12.2012, recalled its order dated 20.07.2006 in so far as it directs the Central Government to implement the recommendation of the Justice Shetty Commission as contained in para 2019.172 of its Report. Accordingly, the encashment of leave admissible to judicial officers in the States shall continue to be subject to applicable Taxes. The above is for information and necessary action. 4.
